Dear Thomas,

International Public Non-profit Organization "Our Heritage" has received two payments: \$17,421.49 from World Evangelical Alliance and \$32,491.50 from Giving Hands to work with refugees during the war waged by the Russian Federation on the territory of Ukraine.

Thank you very much for your contribution for this important and urgent work.

A few days after the beginning of the invasion Our Heritage established hubs to coordinate our activities in two cities of Khmelnytskiy Region by the key leaders of sports movement in Ukraine: Oleksandr Kasprov, Ruslan Muts, Volodymyr Vitruk, and Sergiy Moskovka. About eighty volunteers currently are involved in this work. First location is in Dunaivtsi at Bethlehem Church and the second is in Kamyanets-Podilsky at Message of Peace Church.

Currently, our team does the following:

1. Help-centers

Churches and volunteers have organized refugee help-centers in the territory of Khmelnytsky region. Some refugees live at the help-centers for several days after which they travel abroad, while others stay until the war is over. Together with our partners' efforts we fully provide for the needs in food and money of 20 of these centers, which have the combined capacity to accommodate for up to 1600 refugees at once.

2. Humanitarian shipping of food and medicine

In cooperation with several other mission we received and distribute food, clothes, hygiene products and mattresses. We only pay for transporting expenses. In two weeks we have received 8 shipments (160 tons of food, medicine, clothes and hygiene products) and they are divided as follows: 30% stays in Western Ukraine for help-centers and 70% is sent to the hot spots.

3. Work in hot spots

The work in hot spots is carried out through our network of key leaders with whom we have cooperated since before the invasion. We send them finances for fuel, food and medicine. We also bring the food to these locations and take the refugees on the way back. Some leaders have made a personal choice to stay there and serve others.

We have 16 cargo busses and cars available that regularly go to hot spots.

4. Evacuation

We evacuate people in two ways. First - organized evacuation when we know the amount of people and the place of evacuation. Usually, it is done through local churches and key leaders. For that we use 8 volunteer passenger busses. Second - when we are contacted by individuals or families and we find the way for them to leave their area by joining them with other evacuation teams. We have a pair of special leaders who do this.
