Towards a Global Educational Pact with Representatives of Religions



On 5 October 2021, on the occasion of the World Day of Teachers and Educators, the event "Religions and Education: Towards the Global Educational Pact" took place in the Vatican. Representatives of the world's main religions dialogued with Pope Francis on the great contemporary educational challenges and addressed a greeting to educators from all over the world. At the end, through UNESCO, they asked the world's institutions to put education at the heart of the international agenda.

Opening the meeting of representatives of the world's faiths at the Vatican, the Pope relaunched the appeal for a Global Compact on Education, saying: "We cannot conceal from the new generations the truths that give meaning to life".
