Some manipulate sacred gifting like prophecy and prayer, deceiving people and distorting their purpose to solicit offerings for their benefit. Tragically, many are drawn to these false teachings that cater to their desires rather than aligning with God's truth. Such actions, done in the name of Jesus, are far from His will.

The Bible admonishes believers to discern spirits, seek divine wisdom, and guard against deception, as not all spiritual manifestations are from God (1 John 4:1). We must earnestly pray for forgiveness and deliverance from these exploitative



practices within the body of Christ. The governance of church institutions should reflect the righteousness and purity of Christ.

Let us pray fervently for the vulnerable, that they may not be lured by false spiritual leaders but seek solace and guidance from God, who is the true source of comfort and deliverance.
