

UNITED IN PRAYER: A GLOBAL CALL TO ACTION ON THE 178TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE WORLD EVANGELICAL ALLIANCE

WORLDWIDE PRAYER IS IN THE D.N.A. OF THE WEA

The future of the Christian church often looks challenging. The more the Gospel is proclaimed across the world, the spiritual warfare we face gets fiercer. That is not surprising. Satan is losing territory. Fifty years ago the WEA represented 100 million evangelical Christians. In 2024 it represents 625 million. God's kingdom on earth is growing each year. Satan is getting desperate.

In physical warfare success depends on the personal commitment, courage and training of the soldiers, but during actual battles an essential additional element of success is constant communication with the commanding officer in order. Without communication to achieve coordination there will be chaos and the adversary will win. Spiritual warfare is no different. We have a fierce adversary but our heavenly Commander is in charge. He is omniscient (He knows everything), omnipresent (He is everywhere) and omnipotent (He is all powerful). He expects us to listen to him through prayer and through his written Word and obey to His commands because "the battle is the Lord's" (1 Samuel 17:47).

When the World Evangelical Alliance was established in 1846, prayer was a critical component of its vision to achieve unity amongst the different Christian denominations in the great missionary initiatives of the nineteenth century. Our predecessors designated the first week of January in each year as the Universal Week of Prayer to pray that the Lord would bless their efforts globally in the coming year. In 1946, in his book entitled "Goodly Fellowship" to mark the centenary of the WEA, John W. Ewing wrote "From the beginning of the Evangelical Alliance, prayer has been the secret and inspiration of its life, and it has laid stress on the need of prayer as essential to everything good. With this in mind it has appealed for special and united prayer during the first week of each year, desiring thus to encourage a habit and obtain a grace for the hallowing of the entire year".

Exactly 150 years later, in 1996, the WEA Religious Liberty Commission launched the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church and designated the first Sunday in November (the second Sunday in some countries) to pray for our persecuted brothers and sisters in Christ. In that first year over 100 countries participated, since when the number has grown and many denominations and para-church organisations have joined the united effort in promoting that special day of prayer each November.

As the WEA's seven regional alliances and 143 national alliances look to the future to fulfil their mission in today's uncertain, dangerous and ungodly world, it more important than ever for them to undergird their efforts in united and concentrated prayer. As it has since 1846, the WEA will play its part in emphasising the need for the whole Body of Christ to be united in prayer in its witness to the Gospel across the world. As Jesus prayed in his High Priestly prayer, we must demonstrate to the world that we are one in our mission so that the world will believe that Jesus was sent by the Father to save the world (John 17:21). The battle is the Lord's. We must keep in constant touch with Him through prayer.
