Ephesians 2:13-18

Regional Prayer Journey for GA2025

One passage. Six weeks of focused prayer. One global Gospel vision.

WEEK 1: BROUGHT NEAR BY THE BLOOD OF CHRIST (EPH. 2:13)

- Prayer Focus: Rejoicing that Christ's sacrifice brings us from spiritual distance into God's presence.
- Regional Link: In Argentina, pastors and churches are laboring for Gospel growth while
 carrying heavy physical, emotional, and spiritual burdens. In Central Asia, believers face
 persecution and legal barriers to gathering. Both regions need the reminder that Christ's
 blood has already broken the greatest barrier—our separation from God.
- Prayer Point: Lord, thank You for bringing us near to You through the blood of Christ. As
 You have welcomed us, strengthen pastors in Argentina and sustain persecuted believers
 in Central Asia. May their closeness to You be their courage to proclaim the Gospel in
 every circumstance.

WEEK 2: CHRIST IS OUR PEACE (EPH. 2:14)

- Prayer Focus: Jesus is not just a giver of peace—He is peace Himself, breaking down walls
 of hostility.
- Regional Link: Bolivia longs for reconciliation, national peace, and a Church that mediates
 with a spirit of grace. Across the Middle East and North Africa, believers face division,
 conflict, and the need for peace rooted in Christ, from Israel to Sudan. These contexts
 reveal the deep human longing for the peace only Christ can bring.
- Prayer Point: Lord Jesus, You are our peace. In Bolivia, let the Church model reconciliation
 in public and private life. In MENA nations, dismantle hostility and unite believers across
 cultural, political, and ethnic lines so that Your Gospel peace is both proclaimed and lived.

Jesus is not merely a giver of peace, He Himself is peace, breaking down every wall of hostility.

Christ is our Shalom. By His Lordship, He tore down the barriers of separation and enmity, putting to death hostility among believers. Through the prophet Isaiah (Isa. 26:3–4), God promised us Perfect Peace - in Hebrew, Shalom Shalom. The repetition emphasizes its completeness and depth.

But how do we remain in this Perfect Peace? Isaiah teaches us that it is when our minds are stayed on the Lord: "You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You..."

Trusting God anchors our thoughts in Him, and the result is that we are kept safe in His peace.

WEEK 3: ONE NEW HUMANITY (EPH. 2:15)

- Prayer Focus: In Christ, all believers share one identity—citizens of God's Kingdom.
- Regional Link: In Brazil, the Alliance's work in unity, disaster relief, and climate response shows the world the Gospel's reconciling power. In Europe, the forming of new alliances in Eastern Europe reflects the vision of one Body made from many backgrounds. Both regions are living pictures of God's plan to create one new humanity in Christ.
- Prayer Point: Lord, thank You for making us one new people in You. Bless Brazil's unity projects and Europe's growing alliances so they display to the watching world a Church united in worship, service, and mission, transcending all earthly divisions.

In Christ, all believers share one identity: citizens of God's Kingdom.

His Lordship demolished the walls of division, removing hostility and reconciling us as one. We are now one church, one body, united in Him. This new humanity is anchored not in culture, tribe, or background, but solely in Jesus Christ and His saving grace.

WEEK 4: RECONCILIATION THROUGH THE CROSS (EPH. 2:16)

- Prayer Focus: The cross restores our relationship with God and heals divisions between people.
- Regional Link: Colombia needs peace and healing from violence. In North America, the Church must rise above cultural divisions and display loyalty to Christ over all else. Both regions are ripe for the Gospel's message: reconciliation is not just possible—it has already been secured at the cross.
- Prayer Point: Lord, by Your cross You put hostility to death. Bring healing in Colombia, and
 in the US and Canada make Your Church a living witness of reconciliation. May GA2025
 inspire believers everywhere to be bridge-builders through the Gospel.

The cross restores our relationship with God and heals divisions between people.

Paul highlights that the cross, an instrument of death, has instead become the means of life and reconciliation. To unbelievers, this makes little sense. Yet to those in Christ, the cross represents the ultimate reconciliation: in Him, we are no longer defined by division but by unity and restored fellowship with God and one another.



WEEK 5: PEACE FOR THE FAR AND NEAR (EPH. 2:17)

- Prayer Focus: The Gospel is for all—those who seem far from God and those who think they are near.
- Regional Link: Costa Rica enters a critical election season needing integrity and peace. In Papua New Guinea, the Church stands in a new season of national witness following a historic declaration of being a Christian nation. Both need the Gospel's peace to shape their future.
- Prayer Point: Lord, as You preached peace to those far and near, speak into the heart of Costa Rica's electoral process and Papua New Guinea's national identity. Let the message of GA2025 carry this same peace across nations, cultures, and political divides.

The peace of Christ is available to all; those who seem far from God and those who believe themselves near.

Too often, disagreements among believers are fueled by the assumption that some are "closer" to Christ than others. But Paul reminds us that we are all saved by the same grace, through the same cross, by the same Christ. Peace is for all, without distinction.

WEEK 6: ACCESS TO THE FATHER BY ONE SPIRIT (EPH. 2:18)

- Prayer Focus: All believers share the same Spirit-given access to the Father—no hierarchy, no exclusion.
- Regional Link: Mexico seeks safety, unity among leaders, and revival. In Australia and New
 Zealand, churches are working for Spirit-led unity and nationwide prayer. Both regions
 need to remember that in Christ, all come equally before the Father, empowered by one
 Spirit.
- Prayer Point: Lord, unite believers in Mexico, Australia, and New Zealand in the Spirit's power. May they approach You with boldness, serve You with joy, and welcome all into fellowship as fellow citizens of Your Kingdom.

All believers share Spirit-given access to the Father; no hierarchy, no exclusion.

This verse points us to the work of the Trinity: Jesus, through the cross, provides salvation; the Spirit dwells within us as our Helper; and by the Spirit, we have unhindered access to the Father. This access is not for a select few but is a universal privilege for all who believe.
